



**“Know Your Rights” Presentations at Immigration Detention Center
within Boone County Jail
2019**

Volunteer groups regularly visit the only immigration detention center in Kentucky located at Boone County Jail near Cincinnati to provide comprehensive “Know Your Rights” presentations and materials. Volunteers interview those detained which can lead to *pro bono* (volunteer) legal representation in a limited number of cases. The KYR materials assist detained individuals who do not have an attorney.

Enid Trucios-Haynes, with the support of the Brandeis School of Law at the University of Louisville, manages this public service project involving student and community volunteers. This Know Your Rights program is in collaboration with the National Immigrant Justice Center, and is supervised by Immigration and Customs Enforcement, U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

We meet at Boone County Jail at 7:45 a.m. and generally each visit ends by 12:30 p.m. Any volunteer may leave before the visit is concluded. REGISTER FOR JAIL VISIT: All volunteers must register at: <http://louisville.edu/law/bhrap/our-work/boone-county-jail> A list of volunteers for each visit is sent to ICE (Immigration & Customs Enforcement) before each visit, and only those volunteers on the list will be admitted to the jail.

TRAINING SESSION: All volunteers must attend one training session conducted by Enid Trucios-Haynes *before* going on a Boone County Jail Detention Center visit. The training is held on Thursday evening before each Friday visit at University of Louisville Law School. You can register for the training on the website.
