### **Benefits of *Law Review* Membership**

#### **Academic Recognition**

- *Law Review* membership is one of the top academic honors that a law student can receive.
- Employers immediately recognize and respect the accomplishments of a member.
- Membership remains at the top of resumes and biographies long after GPAs are removed.
- Members develop research and writing skills that prove advantageous in all areas of practice.

#### **Cumulative Course Credit**

- Members receive academic credit for each consecutive accomplishment with the *Law Review*:
  - Two (2) credit hours upon completion of first year membership duties.
  - One (1) credit hour upon completion of second year membership duties.
  - One (1) credit hour for publication of the student-written note.
  - Up to four (4) credit hours for Editorial Board membership.
- In total, members can receive up to seven (7) credit hours for their participation.

#### **Satisfaction of the Writing Requirement**

- Completion of a student note fulfills the law school's writing requirement.
- Members have six months to write their notes, as opposed to fourteen weeks in a regular class.
- Any legal or legally-relevant topic can be chosen for a student note.
- Published student notes are unique and valuable contributions to the legal community.

- Members enjoy access to study resources, mailboxes, printing services, and office supplies.
