

## BRANDEIS SCHOOL OF LAW 2020 SUMMER MENTOR PROGRAM

The University of Louisville, Louis D. Brandeis School of Law announces its Summer Mentorship Program for Rising 2Ls and 3Ls. The University will make efforts to identify mentors who are practicing lawyers in the community, and to pair those lawyers with students who will not be employed full-time at law offices or other legal organizations during the Summer of 2020. The Mentorship Program will provide exciting opportunities to shadow practitioners engaged in the day-to-day practice of law, get acquainted with judges and other legal professionals, and peek behind the scenes of the legal profession in Kentucky and Indiana.

**Directions to Sign-up for Mentor Program via Symplicity:** Interested students should fill out the questionnaire located below. When complete:

- Log onto Symplicity at <https://law-louisville-csm.symplicity.com/>. Go to the “Documents” menu option on the homepage via the left navigation bar and upload this Application after it has been completed using the “Other Documents” radio button. If you do not have a resume uploaded, add one to Symplicity using the “Resume” radio button. Note that a version of this Application in Word format is available in the Document Library or request a copy from Jina Scinta.
- Go OCI module from the menu on the homepage, and then select “Brandeis School of Law Summer Mentorship Program” from the Summer Session. If the Summer Session does not automatically appear on the OCI page, you must select it from the dropdown menu.
- Go to the Mentor Program, make sure both your resume and this Application are showing and hit the “Apply” button. You have now successfully applied. Please note that your resume will not be shared with summer mentor.
