

Changes to Fall 2020 Course Schedule Version 2.19.20

The following revisions have been made to the Fall 2020 course schedule:

- 1) Secured Transactions, LAW-834-05:
 - a) This course will NOT be accelerated but instead will be taught for the entire semester.
 - b) This course is an online hybrid course, meaning that it will meet in person some of the time and be delivered through online work some of the time.
 - c) This course will meet only on Wednesdays from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m.
 - d) This course will have an in-person final exam on Friday, November 20, at 1:00 p.m.
- 2) Writing for the Bar Exam, LAW-999-07
 - a) This course has been added to the course schedule.
 - b) This course is 1 credit and will be taught by Angela Lechleiter.
 - c) This course will meet on Fridays, 8:30-10:10 a.m. in Room 060 in an accelerated manner for the 2nd half of the semester (and therefore does not overlap with Environmental Field Study, which meets during the same time period in the 1st half of the semester).
 - d) This course will meet October 2 to November 13.
- 3) Ordered Liberty I Seminar, LAW-999-06
 - a) This course now has a scheduled day and time: Thursdays, 6:30 to 9:00 p.m., and will meet at locations other than the Law School building.
 - b) This course will not meet every Thursday.
- 4) Water Resources Law & Policy Seminar, LAW-839-78
 - a) This enrollment cap for this course has been corrected to 18 students.
- 5) Civil Rights and Civil Liberties, LAW-927-05
 - a) This course has been removed, because it will be taught in Spring 2021.

6) Special Permissions Courses: The following courses require that student obtain special permission to enroll. Please see Betty Younis. These courses are in addition to the special procedures required for registering for ELC courses.

- a) LAW-840-05, Environmental Field Study (prior or concurrent classwork in environmental or natural resources law: instructor permission from Professor Arnold)
- b) LAW-848-05 and LAW-848-75, Trial Practice (prior completion of Evidence)
- c) LAW-999-06, Ordered Liberty I Seminar (selection as an Ordered Liberty Fellow; instructor permission from Professor Milligan)

Please watch the course schedule for the following changes in the future:

Full-time visiting professors will be added to the schedule to teach Decedents' Estates and Trusts, and Family Law, as well as two upper-level electives in Fall 2020

The specific days and times of Family Law (as well as the two electives taught by visiting professors) will be set once we know who is teaching these courses.
