

The **2022-2023** academic year saw an evolution in our student engagement and campus involvement.

Major Department Highlights

- 1. Announced top 40 in 2022 Best of the Best Colleges & Universities for LGBTQ+ students by Campus Pride Index.
- **2.** Hosted 26 LGBT specific trainings for students, staff, and faculty.
- 3. More than 1800 students, staff, and faculty participated in LGBT Center programming this year
- **4.** SAGA hosted U of L's first Queer Prom with 50 attendees
- 5. 108 students got tested for HIV through a collaboration with the University of Kentucky and Health promotion
- **6.** This year the LGBT Center partnered with 22 different campus partners

Major Highlights

- 1. Pride Kick Off Celebration

 Every year the LGBT Center host a kick-off celebration at the beginning of Pride

 Month. This year the over 300 staff, students, and faculty members participated
 and over 30 departments, student groups, and resource centers tabled to celebrate

 Pride!
- 2. Have Pride Training Series

 This year during Pride Month the LGBT Center hosted it's inaugural Have Pride training series. Staff, students and Faculty were able to receive trainings that focused on Pronouns, Safezone Ally Training, and Coming Out.
- 3. Louisville Youth Group Service Project
 The Bayard Rustin LLC and The Muhammad Ali Scholars partnered to collect clothing during the month of October to donate to Louisville Youth Group. In addition to visiting Louisville Youth Group and performing community service.
- 4. In efforts to increase our visibility the LGBT Center partnered with: Hispanic, Latinx, and Indigenous Initiatives, Health Promotion, Black Male Initiative, Women's Center, PEACC, Muhammad Ali institute.

PINK is U of L's student-produced drag show! In addition to providing great entertainment, PINK is an opportunity for students, faculty, staff, and the broader community to celebrate the rich culture and diversity of U of L's LGBTQ+ and allied community.

This year Pink had over 200 attendees and 20 students perform and volunteer. With the ability to perform drag freely at risk this year's PINK was more important than ever to our students and community. PINK was also hosted on Trans Day of Visibility. During the event the LGBT Center held space for to recognize the trans community.



Education is a key competent of LGBT Center. Over the past year we have partnered with Employee Success to train staff and faculty, Athletics to train student athletes, Fraternity and Sorority Life to train Greek Life, and more.

Safezone

Pronoun Day

The LGBT Center collaborated with the Women's Center to host the inaugural Pronoun Day. The campus was able to engage in a Pronoun Training, games, and the release of the U of L Pronoun Video.

Not All Boys Bleed Blue

In collaboration with Black Male Initiative the LGBT Center hosted a workshop with Black males on campus to explore masculinity and gender identity.



Radical celebration was the purpose of this event. The LGBT Center and NPHC collaborated to celebrate NPHC members from history that were a part of the LGBTQ+ community but their sexual orientation was erased from their identities.

U of L Trans Visibility Month

In solidarity with our trans community the LGBT Center hosted it's 1st ever U of L Trans Visibility Month. This month was filled with events that highlighted the trans experience.


provides supplemental support for under-represented students at the University of Louisville. This service is a component of our retention initiatives for our Rustin LLC students.

This year over 200 students participated in You Don't Have To Come Out To Come In. During this event the LGBT Center and LGBTQ+ student groups welcome ALL students to join us for our Welcome Week Event! Learn about all the ways that you can get involved, meet the staff and student leaders, and get to know other LGBTQ+ students and campus allies.







Lavender Graduation

This year we presented rainbow cords to 54 students.

Lavender Graduation is an annual graduation ceremony conducted at universities to honor LGBTQ+ students. The event honors the unique challenges that LGBTQ+ students overcome while working towards their degrees, and well as their contributions and achievements. At UofL, Lavender Graduation is hosted by the LGBT Center and in the Spring. During the event, each graduate is presented with rainbow cords that can be worn at commencement.

Bayard Rustin LGBT and Social Justice Themed Living Community

There was a total of 30 students who resided in the Bayard Rustin LGBT and Social Justice Themed Living Community. The Rustin LLC also offered students the opportunity to live and study with other LGBTQ+ student, learn about social justice and activism, 1 on 1 coaching, and monthly community nights.

SAGA (Sexuality and Gender Alliance)

SAGA works to empower and support people all across the spectrum.

We are a student-run organization that focuses on LGBT+ rights, advocacy, and equity. We are UofL's general LGBTQ+ student group. We welcome all - LGBTQ+ and allies - to join.

Meetings are a safe space to discuss, socialize, and form connections. SAGA is also involved in hosting larger campus events to spread awareness of LGBTQ+ topics to the UofL community and beyond.

Cardinal Drag Haus

The Cardinal Drag Haus is a student organization dedicated to allowing students to explore the art of drag in a safe space for creativity and unique perspectives.

Our goal is to introduce students into the world of drag, allow local drag artists to express themselves in and out of the organization, get students involved in the community to support all forms of drag across the Louisville area, and celebrate the freedom of art.

Shades

Dedicated to empowering LGBTQ+ students of color, Shades includes both support for those who want to connect with helping others and public advocacy for our members who want to work on all forms of racism and homophobia on campus.

Speed Spectrum

Speed Spectrum works to promote awareness of LGBTQ+ identities and challenges, as well as provide a safe space in Speed School for students, staff, and faculty. Though the group does focus on the needs of engineering students, it is open to students with all majors and degree programs.
