KRIS V. KOWDLEY, M.D.

Dr. Kowdley is internationally recognized as a clinician, educator and researcher in the area of liver disease and has presented his research on liver diseases at more than 135 national and international meetings and scientific symposia. He is the author of over 375 articles, book chapters, reviews and commentaries in this area and has been published in the Annals of Internal Medicine, Archives of Surgery, Gastroenterology, Hepatology, American Journal of Physiology, New England Journal of Medicine, and among other professional publications.

Dr. Kowdley has extensive experience in clinical trials in all areas of liver disease, ranging from hepatitis C, cholestatic liver disease, nonalcoholic steatohepatitis and hepatitis B.

He has been a principal investigator in several NIDDK-sponsored clinical trials in primary biliary cirrhosis, primary sclerosing cholangitis and is a member of executive committee of the nonalcoholic steatohepatitis clinical research network (NASH CRN).

Dr. Charles Landis is a gastroenterologist in Seattle, Washington and is affiliated with multiple hospitals in the area, including UW Medicine/Harborview Medical Center and University of Washington Medical Center.
