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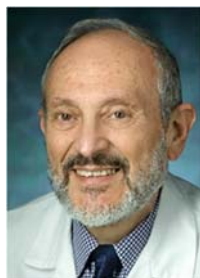

**COLEMAN SMITH, MD**

Dr. Smith received his medical degree from the University of Sydney, Australia and subsequently completed his internal medicine and gastroenterology training at that institution. He went on to spend three years at the University of Queensland in Australia where he completed a research doctoral thesis. He subsequently continued his research and clinical training in Denmark, at USC and Stanford University.

He moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota in 1985 where he joined the faculty of the University of Minnesota and remained there until he moved to

Georgetown University in Washington, DC in 2015. He is currently a transplant hepatologist at the Medstar Georgetown Transplant Institute and a professor of medicine at Georgetown University School of Medicine.

He is very actively involved in the American Association for the Study of Liver Diseases and has served on a number of committees including on the executive committee of the Clinical Practice Special Interest Group. He was the founding chairman of the Mid West branch of the American Liver Foundation and is currently a member of the National Medical Advisory Board of the American Liver Foundation.

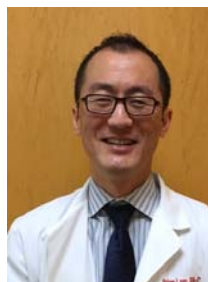


**KIRTI SHETTY, MD, FACG**

Dr. Kirti Shetty is currently Professor of Medicine at the University of Maryland School of Medicine and Adjunct Professor of Medicine and Surgery at Georgetown University. She serves as the Director of Hepatology at the University of Maryland.

Her clinical interests include viral hepatitis, nonalcoholic fatty liver disease, liver cancer and liver transplantation outcomes. Dr. Shetty's research focuses on mechanisms of hepatocarcinogenesis in cirrhosis. Her ongoing translational research collaborations explore biomarkers for hepatocellular carcinoma and chemopreventive approaches in patients with cirrhosis.

Dr. Shetty has authored numerous publications in prestigious journals and has both contributed to and edited textbooks in liver disease. She attained her medical degree at Christian Medical College in Vellore, India.

As a physician assistant and research investigator in Northern Virginia, Brian Lam has enjoyed the privilege of working in hepatology for over a decade.
