**IRA JACOBSON, MD**

Dr. Ira Jacobson earned his BS summa cum laude from Yale University and his MD from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. After completing an internship and residency at the University of California San Francisco he trained as a fellow in gastroenterology and Hepatology at Massachusetts General Hospital and Harvard Medical School.

In 1984, he joined the faculty at Weill Cornell Medical College and New York Presbyterian Hospital. During his 30 years at Weill Cornell, Dr. Jacobson served as Chief of the Division of the Gastroenterology and Hepatology from 1998-2015 and was Vincent Astor Distinguished Professor of Medicine as well as Medical Director of the Center for the Study of Hepatitis C. In March 2015 he assumed the position of Chair of Medicine at Mount Sinai Beth Israel Medical Center, and Vice Chair of Medicine and co-Director of the Liver Institute at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.



**ROBERT S. BROWN, Jr., MD, MPH**

Robert S. Brown, Jr., MD, MPH is Vice Chair of Transitions of Care and Interim Chief of the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology in the Department of Medicine Weill Cornell Medical College in New York, New York. He is also Professor of Clinical Medicine at Columbia University College of Physicians & Surgeons. Dr. Brown is the Director of the Center for Liver Disease and Transplantation at New York-Presbyterian Hospital in New York.

Dr. Brown is an internationally known expert in liver disease and liver transplantation. He has co-authored over 150 peer-reviewed articles most dedicated to viral hepatitis and liver transplantation and has extensive research funding in those areas.
