5. List appropriate evaluations in the workup of scarring and non-scarring alopecia
6. Recognize and treat cutaneous infections and infestations
7. List surgical techniques that can be incorporated in a surgical clinic to improve efficiency.
8. Design a program for management of moderate to severe atopic dermatitis incorporating new topical and systemic therapeutic options.
9. Recognize the clinical phenotypes associated with specific auto-antibodies in dermatomyositis and describe the implications for prognosis and treatment
10. Design a systematic plan for evaluation and management of chronic pruritus.

- > Familiarize yourself with recommended and new therapeutic protocols.
- > Gain knowledge in regard to interpreting diagnostic tests for cutaneous diseases.
