Symposium Overview

This adult developmental medicine course (second annual) will present a multidisciplinary approach needed for the care and treatment of adult patients with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in order to educate and inform health care providers, patients and their caregivers about best current practices and future treatment directions for patients with IDD. Several disciplines will be represented including Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy, Neurology, Internal Medicine, Dentistry, Social Work and Advocacy. Concurrent breakout sessions will occur in Medicine, Dentistry, Social Work/ Case Management, Psychiatry/Behavioral Management, and Therapy Services, which will stimulate insightful healthcare provider and patient discussions in a collaborative environment and improve the regional standard of care.

Target Audience

This activity will be most appropriate for learners currently engaged in clinical practice or other professional activities related to the care of patients with IDD.

Learning Objectives

As a result of participating in this activity, the participants should be able to:

- Identify the barriers in transitioning a child with neurodevelopmental disabilities into the provider network for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Recognize the importance of Occupational Therapy at providing assistive devices and realizing their positive impact on overall quality of life for the adult with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Identify Autism, the need for multidisciplinary care, and learn about the efforts in Kentucky for providing that care.
- Advance the advocacy efforts being undertaken in Kentucky to improve overall healthcare for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
