

Jeffrey M. Bumpous, M.D.
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SUMMARY STATEMENT

Jeffrey Bumpous, MD, born at Martin Army Hospital in Fort Benning (now Fort Moore), Georgia, is a graduate of Paducah Tilghman High School in Paducah, Kentucky and a Magna Cum Laude graduate with a Bachelor of Sciences Degree in Biology and Chemistry from Morehead State University. Dr. Bumpous is an Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society member, elected while matriculating at the University of Louisville School of Medicine where he graduated in 1988. Following his fellowship in Advanced Head and Neck and Skull Base Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh, Dr. Bumpous entered academic medicine at the University of Louisville in 1994 where he assembled a first of its kind multidisciplinary head and neck cancer clinic and tumor board that increased the size of the head and neck service at the University of Louisville. As director, Dr. Bumpous converted the Division of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery into the first Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and Communicative Disorders at the University of Louisville School of Medicine, becoming the first Chair of the newly created Department in 2015. The Department now has over 25 faculty, is ranked in the Blue Ridge Rankings for Research in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and has over 100 learners in the program with a full compendium of educational, research and clinical services.

Dr. Bumpous' leadership in the medical school, UofL Health System and the University have been highlighted through his role as Chair of the Commission on Cancer and the Cancer Committee, Secretary and Treasurer of University of Louisville Physicians, Chair of the Board of Directors of University Medical Center, Co-Chair of the 2020-2026 University of Louisville Strategic Plan, Interim Dean of the School of Medicine and Vice President of Academic Medical Affairs. On the national and international levels Dr. Bumpous has served in multiple offices, most notably President of the Society of University Otolaryngologists, President of the Association of Academic Departments of Otolaryngology-HNS and was Past President and Executive Committee member of the American Board of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. Dr. Bumpous has been a named lecturer at multiple U.S. Medical Schools and an invited lecturer on Head and Neck Surgical Topics internationally in Korea, Canada and India.
