

Ophthalmic Technician News

Two of our senior ophthalmic technicians, Lisa Wheeler and Jael Gonzalez-Ramos worked with Jennifer Noel, Ph.D. over the past four months to learn electrophysiology and vision testing. Specifically, they have participated in a semester long course and are now proficient in the conduction full-field and multi-focal electroretinograms (ERGs), Flash and Pattern Visually Evoked Potentials (VEPs), Dark Adaptation tests, and Color Vision tests. During the course, Jael and Lisa performed the prescribed tests under supervision and have demonstrated competencies in performing all prescribed tests as well as communicating results to our faculty and physicians. The department now has an internally run vision testing lab. All referrals are welcome.
