- Grant proposals University prefers 10 days prior to deadline to process, minimal 5 days needed to process, reach out early for guidance; dept needs two weeks in advance to assist & meet deadlines, best to reach out at the time you determine you plan to apply for award
- Integration update good meeting held last Friday with leadership from NHC & UofL together; thanks to Dr.
   Boland for work to resolve F&A issue, came to a verbal agreement; legal working on, hope to have signed document in a few weeks, anticipate integration on May 1<sup>st</sup>
- PIRATs scholarship conferences occur 12:00 1:00 on Mondays the week after faculty meeting; Stevenson leads
  initiative, now set on Zoom platform, Dianna Stover sending calendar invitations, NHC CME available, like to see

## Vicki Montgomery | Patient Safety

- 110 days without CLABSI in the entire hospital, longest ever, PICU 369 days, NICU 2 in 2020 & 0 in 2019; doing well with catheter associated UTIs; tracking employee injuries & planning an Employee Reaching for Zero team
- Good catch of the month October through January, Kierston Yaden, Kelly Decker, Kayla Miller and Tristen
  Murray; all catches involved ordering mistakes; encouraged those with supervising trainees to use Reaching for
  Zero prevention strategy of STAR (Stop, Think, Ask, Review) before signing off
- Shout out to all involved with NCH/NCMG Surgical verification site visit; program successfully verified, Level I Surgery Program, 1 of 28 children's hospitals successfully completed
- Shout out to trainee, Julia Sparks, created a clear & complete communication in EMR regarding a patient in ED, great human interaction, shared with the residents & hospital as example
- Shout out from Dr. Jeff White to multiple disciplines, transport team, nursing & others, came together to make possible for child with complex GU needs to get hyperbaric oxygen therapy
- 2020 successes include NCH for reaching 100% of annual goals CLABSI, full deployment of Sepsis guideline
  including Code Sepsis, full deployment of PIVIE prevention, doing well with mislabeled specimens with less than
  100 this year
- Anyone interested in safety and quality training can receive MOC4 credit for participation in Reaching for Zero committee activities, contact Montgomery
- 12 patients with Nephrotoxic medications associated with AKI since started this work January 2019, continue to make progress
- Unplanned extubations work continues, focused on NICU, 130 in 2016, 43 in 2020, 81 babies since 2017 with no significant destabilizing event; 74 CICU/PICU patients
- Strategies learned over time are still relevant, good outcomes achieved; faculty encouraged to think about role in leading change at the bedside & commit again to support Reach for Zero Program

#### **Jennifer Evans | Clinical Operations**

- Boland encouraged the mindset & culture of "just say of yes", especially with patient care, thanks to those contributing to that culture
- Evans & Boland been meeting with pediatric outreach partners around state, heard positive comments, access improved, availability of subspecialists to talk, making noticeable change, reminder if a patient is late for an appointment, do everything to see the patient
