- October: Tristan Murray – diazepam ordering

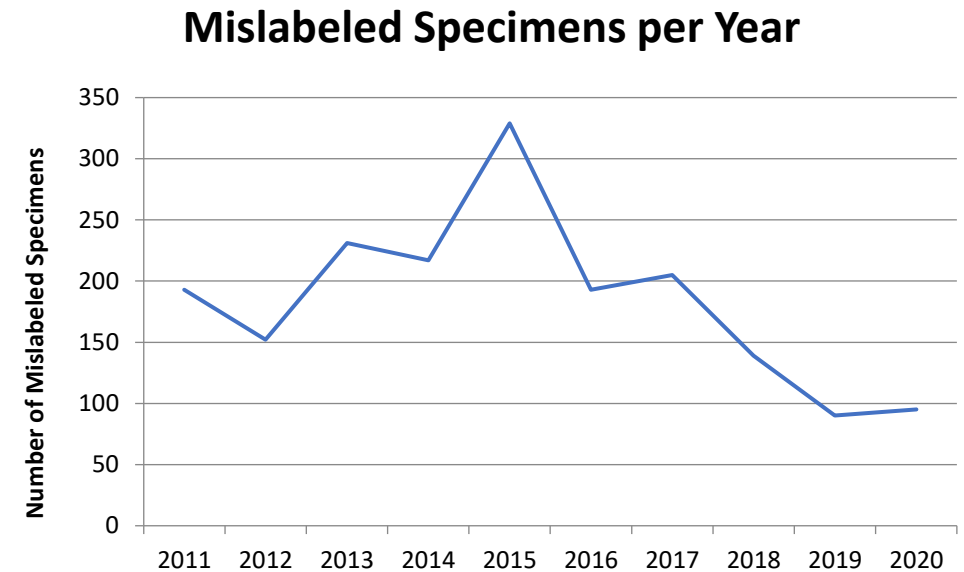
Shout outs!

- From Dr. Jeffrey White to the multiple disciplines, transport team, nursing and others who came together to make it possible for a child to get hyperbaric oxygen therapy



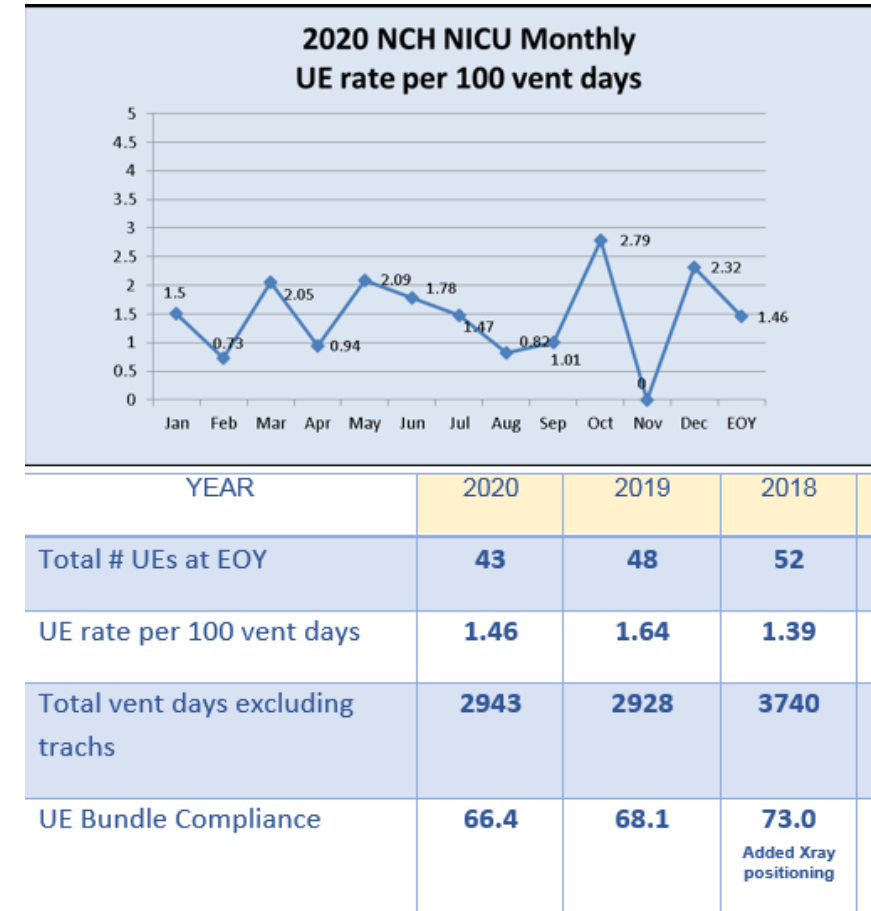
2020 Successes

- NCH – 100% of goals
- NICU – 2 CLABSI
- No CLABSI at NCH for 108 days
- Fully deployed sepsis guideline, including Code Sepsis
- Fully deployed PIVIE prevention
- Misabeled specimens – 95/year (329 in 2015), 0.27 (0.85) per 1000 specimens



UPDATES

- **MOC4** credit available for participation in Reaching for Zero Committee activities. If you want to join the committee, just let me know.
- **Guidelines – MOC4** credit available for leading or participating in Guideline development and implementation
- **Surgical Site Infection – Colon**
- **Nephrotoxic medication** associated acute kidney injury
 - 1 child about every 2.5 days with an exposure event
 - Since January 2019 in general medical-surgical patients – 12 kids who developed AKI (patients who had creatinine measured)
- **Unplanned extubation**, especially in the NICU
 - 130 in 2016 vs 43 in 2020
 - 81 babies since 2017 who did not have a significant destabilizing event; 74 CICU/PICU patients
 - Since 2017 didn't spend over \$14,000,000

| Behavior expectation | Related error prevention tool |

| Everyone makes a personal commitment to safety: <i>"We do the right thing."</i> | 1. Name game 2. ARCC 3. STAR |
| Everyone is accountable for clear and complete communication: <i>"We are one team."</i> | 1. SBAR 2. Three-way communication 3. Clarifying questions 4. Standardized handoff |
| Everyone supports a questioning attitude: <i>"We get results."</i> | 1. Qualify, Validate and Verify 2. Stop and resolve |
