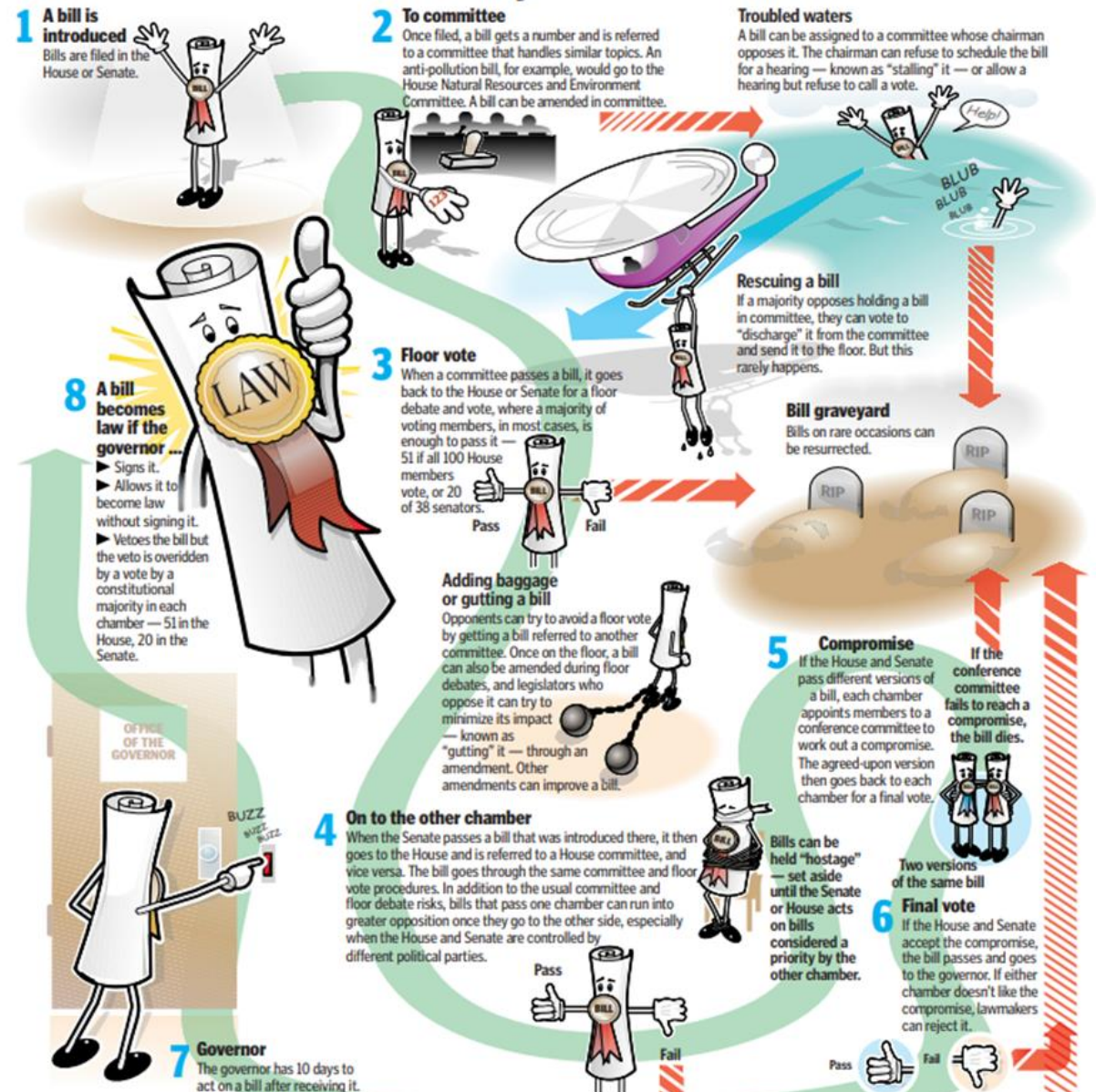

Protocol for Speaking with Elected Officials

(3/22/2021)

The University of Louisville is committed to maintaining a presence in Louisville, Frankfort, and Washington, D.C. in order to advance the University's interest and monitor legislation that could affect the University, its faculty and staff, and its students.

The University also recognizes the importance of each faculty and staff member's individual right to participate in the democratic process and communicate with your federal, state, and local government officials, and the University encourages you to exercise your right to do so.

Bills to know about...

HB 470 [bill.pdf \(ky.gov\)](#)

this bill seeks to revoke the medical license of any provider who provides or refers for gender-affirming care under age 18. It also seeks to cut off all public and private insurance funding for gender transition at any age as well as end all current care and hold providers of care liable for damages for 30 years

Passed House Judiciary Committee (14-7) and House Floor (75-22) 3/2/23 → Senate??



SB 150

“Require specific parental notifications from public schools; require school districts to adopt specific procedures related to parental rights; limit authority of the Kentucky Board of Education and Kentucky Department of Education in relation to parental rights and a student's use of pronouns; prohibit district or school policies with the intent of keeping student information confidential for parents; prohibit a school district from requiring school personnel or pupils to use pronouns for students that do not conform to that student's biological sex; provide school districts and district personnel authority to seek emergency medical services for a student; provide conditions for student confidentiality; amend KRS 158.1415 to establish requirements for any public school's course, curriculum, or program on the subject of human sexuality.”
