Personal Social Networks as Assets in Decreasing Problematic Substance Use among LGBTQ+ Peoples of Color

Facilitated by Emma Sterrett-Hong, PhD (she/her)

Description: Dr. Sterrett-Hong will present findings from her research on naturally occurring interpersonal resources among LGBTQ+ communities of color, and how they can promote healthy functioning, with regard to both substance use and mental health. Findings from a study on the social networks of young cisgender gay, bisexual, pansexual and otherwise termed sexual minority males will be discussed. In addition, a community-partnered project involving a Combined Ball & Drag Show to promote self-awareness and knowledge of substance use concerns also will be described. Participants will gain a greater understanding of social networks and chosen families as important supports for LGBTQ+ people of color.

- To explain the importance of social networks and chosen families as support systems for LGBTQ+ people of color
- To demonstrate how support systems can be used as a tool to promote awareness and knowledge of substance use concerns


