PEOPLE

An endowment is an investment in the future of the School of Medicine. Your generous support aids our people in all of their academic endeavors.

Scholarships: \$50,000 (per student)

A named scholarship funds specific academic disciplines with restrictions and preferences.

Endowed Professorship: \$1,000,000

Professorships help the school recruit and retain researchers and teachers. The funds support the work of our talented faculty.

Endowed Chair: \$3,000,000

An endowed chair is the highest honor at the school for faculty members. Endowed chairs help recruit and retain top researchers and teachers by offering unwavering support for their work.

PLACES

Our places are crucial for enhanced education and research. We are making great strides to improve the campus experience for our faculty, residents and students but there is much more to creating state-of-the-art places for learning and exploration.

Research Facilities: \$1,000 - 100,000

Lab updates could range from equipment to full renovations across the medical campus.

Lecture Halls: \$10,000

Classroom renovations that update the flooring, ceilings, furniture and lighting will improve the learning experience.

Learning Labs: \$50,000

AV equipment that enhances teaching and quality instruction.

New Student Lounge: \$500,000

The main instructional building for the SOM is re-envisioned to support the needs of the SOM today and the foreseeable future.

PROGRAMS

Our programs not only enrich our academic curriculum but also provide our students with unique opportunities to investigate interests, learn independently, and grow as medical professionals.

Medical Student Distinction Tracks: \$20,000 (per track)

An extracurricular opportunity in research, medical education, public and global health, or business and leadership that provides students a mentored, longitudinal experience for academic exploration and scholarly productivity.

Wellness Program: \$100,000

The "Being Well" initiative includes resources, programs and specialized curriculum that promote health, resilience, and compassion.

MD/PhD Program: \$750,000

This comprehensive program includes two years in preclinical medical training, followed by graduate training in one of UofL's basic research departments, and two years of medical rotations for clinical training.

OTHER INITIATIVES

We are dedicated to promoting health equity and supporting inclusive excellence.

Pre-Matriculation Program: \$1,000 (per student)

Students that are underrepresented in medicine or from underserved rural areas are offered a 3-week introduction to medical school with counseling and pre-instruction.

Summer Health Professions Education Program: \$50,000

Serving as the largest recruitment program of those underrepresented in medicine by providing first-generation applicants and those from rural areas priority admission.

Endowed Excellence Fund for Diversity: \$100,000

Established by School of Medicine faculty to address systemic racism, the fund provides scholarships, resident stipends, and faculty recruitment and retention packages.





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
