## **Important Tips:**

- Do NOT let young children play with fireworks of any type, even sparklers.
- Always wear protective eyewear when handling fireworks and ensure that all bystanders are also wearing eye protection.
- Leave the lighting of professional-grade fireworks to trained pyrotechnicians

If an Eye Injury from Fireworks Occurs:

Seek medical attention immediately!

Do not rub your eyes.

Do not rinse your eyes.

Do not apply pressure.

**Do not** remove any objects that are stuck in the eye.

**Do not** apply ointments or take any blood-thinning pain medications such as aspirin or ibuprofen.
