~ Request for Proposals ~

The James Graham Brown Cancer Center (JGBCC) is funding fellowships for early stage research investigators in Immuno-Oncology. These fellowships are made possible by the Lindy and Bill Street Gift to the JGBCC supporting a proposed Department of Cancer Biology and Medicine. A “Street Fellow” will be a talented junior investigator, with the goal of developing a project, and who is an investigator that would be a suitable Project candidate for the BCC COBRE Center for Cancer Immunology and Immunotherapy.

Applicants must be postdoctoral fellows, Instructors, or Assistant Professors at the University of Louisville or an affiliated institution (e.g., the Louisville VA) and an active member of the JGBCC at the time of application. Applicants may include junior faculty, who are unfunded and initiating new research efforts in cancer immunology and immunotherapy.

The Street Fellowships will be awarded for one-year, with a total budget of \$75,000.

Fellowships will be awarded through the JGBCC; thus, no overhead will be charged and a proposal clearance form is not required.

Requirements:

Letter of Recommendation

Application:

Margins: 0.5” all around; and 11 pt. font as per NIH guidelines)

Research Description:

Lay Abstract, Significance, and Impact: Limit 2 pages combined.

Scientific Abstract, Research Plan, and Milestones: Limit 2 pages combined.

NIH Biosketch.

Proposals will be due *October 5, 2020*, as ONE PDF to dkkonz01@louisville.edu.

Proposals will be reviewed through the Review Committee, and reviews will be completed within two weeks. Fellowships for this cycle of funding will begin November 2020.

Upon funding, recipients will receive an account from the JGBCC fiscal office, which will administer the grant. Use of these funds is restricted to support of research activities, including faculty salary (limited to the awardee) and technical support, supplies, animal costs, and minor equipment (<\$1,000). Funds will NOT support student tuition & fees, travel or publications.

In all instances, regulatory approvals (e.g., IRB, IACUC, IBC) are the responsibility of the applicant. *Please note:* No Fellowship will be funded until all valid, applicable approval letters have been submitted to Diane Konzen.
