

## Addressing ELSI Issues in Unregulated Health

### Research Using Mobile Devices

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF COLLABORATORS**

There are several different categories of individuals collaborating in this research project. Members of each group have different responsibilities.

##### *Investigators*

Investigators from the University of Louisville, Sage Bionetworks, Vanderbilt University, and Cincinnati Children's Hospital are responsible for planning and directing all of the aims of this research, including meetings, publications, budget, and relations with NIH.

##### *Working Group – Authors*

Working Group Authors are invited and encouraged to attend all four of the Working Group meetings (San Diego, Chicago, Atlanta, and Houston). They will be asked to give a presentation on an assigned topic and to participate in discussions at all of the meetings. In addition, they have agreed to write a paper for publication in the symposium issue of the *Journal of Law, Medicine & Ethics* at the completion of the grant.

##### *Working Group – Discussants*

Working Group Discussants are invited and encouraged to attend all four of the Working Group meetings (San Diego, Chicago, Atlanta, and Houston). They may be asked to give a presentation on an assigned topic and will participate in discussions at all of the meetings. They are not responsible for writing an article for publication in the symposium issue of the *Journal of Law, Medicine & Ethics* at the completion of the grant.

##### *Speakers*

Speakers who are not Working Group members will be invited to attend a single meeting and to give a presentation on an assigned topic. One or more speakers may be invited to attend the Working Group meetings in San Diego, Chicago, and Atlanta; the App Developers Workshop in San Francisco; and the Policy Workshop in Washington, DC.

##### *Changes in Responsibilities*

It is assumed that some collaborators will want to change their responsibilities due to conflicting personal or professional obligations. This is especially the case with Working Group Authors who determine that they are unable to draft an article on their topic and therefore would like to switch to being a Working Group Discussant. Similarly, Working Group Discussants may decide that they want to write an article for the symposium and therefore would like to become a Working Group Author.
