Beskow</u>, M.P.H., Ph.D. received her B.S. in nutrition from Iowa State University and her M.P.H. with a concentration in health law from Boston University. She completed her Ph.D. in Health Policy and Administration, with a minor in Epidemiology, at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

She is currently Professor of Health Policy at the Vanderbilt Center for Biomedical Ethics & Society and the Department of Health Policy in the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine. Her work focuses on ethics and policy issues in

biomedical research—particularly human subjects issues in large-scale genomic and translational research. She has been a Principal Investigator on empirical studies of research recruitment, informed consent, confidentiality protections, the return of research results to participants and families, and the research use of electronic health records.

Nationally, she chaired the eMERGE Network's Informed Consent Task Force, cochaired a committee for NCI's initiative to develop a concise informed consent template for cancer clinical trials, and served on the Subpart A Subcommittee of the Secretary's Advisory Committee for Human Research Protections, and the Federal Advisory Committee for the National Children's Study. She is an active participant in the NIH Precision Medicine Initiative's All of Us Research Program.

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
