Professor Rothstein has concentrated his research on health privacy, bioethics, genetics, and public health. From 1999-2008, he was a member of the National Committee on Vital

and Health Statistics (NCVHS), where he chaired the Subcommittee on Privacy and Confidentiality. He is a past president of the American Society of Law, Medicine and Ethics, an elected member of the American Law Institute, and an elected fellow of the Hastings Center.

Since 2011, he has served as Department Editor for Public Health Ethics and Law of the American Journal of Public Health. Since 2000, he has written a regular column on bioethics for the Journal of Law, Medicine and Ethics. Among his many honors, he was a 2013 recipient of the Louis D. Brandeis Privacy Award from Patient Privacy Rights.

Along with John Wilbanks, he serves as co-PI of "Addressing ELSI Issues in Unregulated Health Research Using Mobile Devices," a three-year grant funded by the National Cancer Institute, the National Human Genome Research Institute, the Office of Science Policy, and the Office of the Director of the National Institutes of Health.
