## Sec. 3.3.2 Jurisdiction and Purposes

Except as otherwise provided, each faculty shall have general legislative powers over all matters pertaining to its own personnel policies, criteria, and procedures, to its own meetings, and to the admission requirements, curricula, instruction, examinations, and recommendations to the Board of Trustees for granting of degrees in its own academic unit. All such actions shall be consistent with enumerated policies of the Board of Trustees.

The Faculty Senate, after proceeding in the manner stated in <u>Section 3.4.2.A</u> may state its disapproval of any action of the faculty that seriously affects the general interest of the University, and may recommend appropriate action to the President as chief educational officer of the University.

Questions of academic jurisdiction between faculties of academic units shall be resolved by the President or President's designee in consultation with the Faculty Senate or affected faculty bodies.
