

Undergraduate Students Post-Graduation Education and Employment

2020-21 Executive Summary


The University of Louisville and Institutional Effectiveness (IE) collect information related to students' continuing education and employment plans after graduation through the following sources:

- Degree Application collected at the time the student applies for graduation
- Graduating Student Survey administered between the time the student applies for graduation and the commencement ceremony
- First Destination Survey administered to the student three months following commencement and open for six months

In combination, these surveys provide useful information regarding students' initial post-graduate plans, their more solidified intentions at the time of graduation, and their actual experiences post-graduation. This report summarizes these self-reported student responses. Responses presented here represent the most recent information collected for each student.

Post-Graduation Plans

For the 2020-21 academic year, 2,991 students earned a Bachelor's degree. Of those students, 2,262 provided information about their primary post-graduation plans.




- 38.78% (1,160) indicated they were employed full time (on average 30 hours or more per week)
- 6.52% (195) indicated they were employed part time (on average less than 30 hours per week)
- 14.64% (438) indicated they were enrolled in a program of continuing education
- 0.64% (19) indicated they were not seeking employment or continuing education at that time

- 0.07% (2) indicated they were participating in a volunteer or service program (e.g. Peace Corps)
- 5.35% (160) indicated they were planning to continue education but were not yet enrolled
- 8.76% (262) indicated they were seeking employment
- 0.87% (26) indicated they were serving in the U.S. military
- 24.37% (729) provided no information regarding their post-graduation plans

Salary

For the 2020-21 academic year, 1,158 students graduating with a Bachelor's degree provided information on their pre-tax salary.



- 0.94% (28) indicated making \$0
- 3.88% (116) indicated making less than \$10,000
- 5.82% (174) indicated making \$10,000-\$19,999
- 5.32% (159) indicated making \$20,000-\$29,999
- 5.25% (157) indicated making \$30,000-\$39,999
- 4.45% (133) indicated making \$40,000-\$49,999
- 4.81% (144) indicated making \$50,000-\$59,999
- 4.61% (138) indicated making \$60,000-\$69,999
- 1.87% (56) indicated making \$70,000-\$79,999
- 0.80% (24) indicated making \$80,000-\$89,999
- 0.40% (12) indicated making \$90,000-\$99,999
- 0.40% (12) indicated making \$100,000-\$149,999
- 0.17% (5) indicated making \$150,000 or more
- 61.28% (1,833) provided no information regarding their salary
