

Undergraduate Students Post-Graduation Education and Employment

2021-22 Executive Summary


The University of Louisville and Institutional Effectiveness (IE) collect information related to students' continuing education and employment plans after graduation through the following sources:

- Degree Application collected at the time the student applies for graduation
- Graduating Student Survey administered between the time the student applies for graduation and the commencement ceremony
- First Destination Survey administered to the student three months following commencement and open for six months

In combination, these surveys provide useful information regarding students' initial post-graduate plans, their more solidified intentions at the time of graduation, and their actual experiences post-graduation. This report summarizes these self-reported student responses. Responses presented here represent the most recent information collected for each student.

Post-Graduation Plans

For the 2021-22 academic year, 2,923 students earned a Bachelor's degree. Of those students, 2,509 provided information about their primary post-graduation plans.




- 46.94% (1,372) indicated they were employed full time (on average 30 hours or more per week)
- 6.77% (198) indicated they were employed part time (on average less than 30 hours per week)
- 15.70% (459) indicated they were enrolled in a program of continuing education
- 0.58% (17) indicated they were not seeking employment or continuing education at that time

- 0.24% (7) indicated they were participating in a volunteer or service program (e.g. Peace Corps)
- 6.12% (179) indicated they were planning to continue education but were not yet enrolled
- 8.93% (261) indicated they were seeking employment
- 0.55% (16) indicated they were serving in the U.S. military
- 14.16% (414) provided no information regarding their post-graduation plans

Salary

For the 2021-22 academic year, 1,331 students graduating with a Bachelor's degree provided information on their pre-tax salary.

- 3.87% (113) indicated making less than \$10,000
- 5.13% (150) indicated making \$10,000-\$19,999
- 5.17% (151) indicated making \$20,000-\$29,999
- 6.91% (202) indicated making \$30,000-\$39,999
- 5.92% (173) indicated making \$40,000-\$49,999
- 6.57% (192) indicated making \$50,000-\$59,999
- 4.65% (136) indicated making \$60,000-\$69,999
- 3.04% (89) indicated making \$70,000-\$79,999
- 1.54% (45) indicated making \$80,000-\$89,999
- 0.65% (19) indicated making \$90,000-\$99,999
- 0.86% (25) indicated making \$100,000-\$149,999
- 0.38% (11) indicated making \$150,000 or more
- 54.46% (1,592) provided no information regarding their salary
