

Undergraduate Students Post-Graduation Education and Employment

2022-23 Executive Summary


The University of Louisville and Institutional Effectiveness (IE) collect information related to students' continuing education and employment plans after graduation through the following sources:

- Degree Application collected at the time the student applies for graduation
- Graduating Student Survey administered between the time the student applies for graduation and the commencement ceremony
- First Destination Survey administered to the student three months following commencement and open for six months

In combination, these surveys provide useful information regarding students' initial post-graduate plans, their more solidified intentions at the time of graduation, and their actual experiences post-graduation. This report summarizes these self-reported student responses. Responses presented here represent the most recent information collected for each student.

Post-Graduation Plans

For the 2022-23 academic year, 2,938 students earned a Bachelor's degree. Of those students, 2,524 provided information about their primary post-graduation plans.




- 44.62% (1,311) indicated they were employed full time (on average 30 hours or more per week)
- 7.52% (221) indicated they were employed part time (on average less than 30 hours per week)
- 18.52% (544) indicated they were enrolled in a program of continuing education
- 0.27% (8) indicated they were not seeking employment or continuing education at that time

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- 0% (0) indicated they were participating in a volunteer or service program (e.g. Peace Corps)
- 5.99% (176) indicated they were planning to continue education but were not yet enrolled
- 8.48% (249) indicated they were seeking employment
- 0.51% (15) indicated they were serving in the U.S. military
- 14.09% (414) provided no information regarding their post-graduation plans

Salary

For the 2022-23 academic year, 1,255 students graduating with a Bachelor's degree provided information on their pre-tax salary.



- 0.82% (24) indicated making \$0
- 3.88% (114) indicated making less than \$10,000
- 4.08% (120) indicated making \$10,000-\$19,999
- 5.75% (169) indicated making \$20,000-\$29,999
- 5.89% (173) indicated making \$30,000-\$39,999
- 5.51% (162) indicated making \$40,000-\$49,999
- 5.31% (156) indicated making \$50,000-\$59,999
- 5.07% (149) indicated making \$60,000-\$69,999
- 3.34% (98) indicated making \$70,000-\$79,999
- 1.33% (39) indicated making \$80,000-\$89,999
- 0.44% (13) indicated making \$90,000-\$99,999
- 1.02% (30) indicated making \$100,000-\$149,999
- 0.27% (8) indicated making \$150,000 or more
- 57.28% (1,683) provided no information regarding their salary
