3D Printing

UofL medical, engineering and bioengineering faculty and students are changing lives with 3D printing. A UofL faculty team created a 3D model of a 14-month-old boy's heart to prepare for life-saving surgery, while bioengineering students provided three bionic hands for a young boy born without fingers.

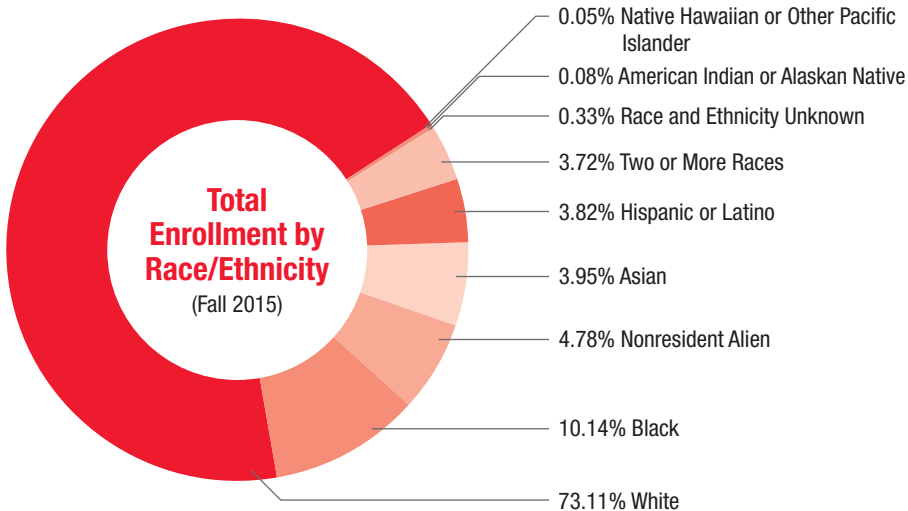

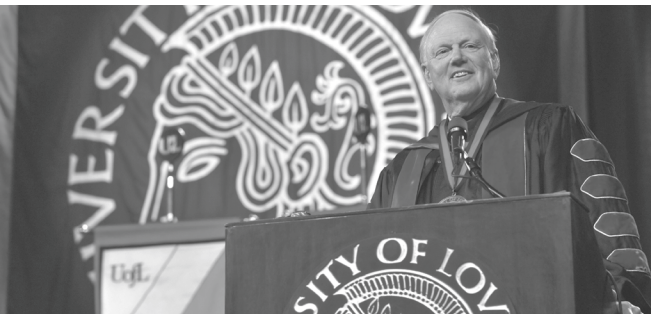
