## QUALITY VS. QUANTITY

UofL has raised its admissions standards three times over the past six years to emphasize the quality of student we attract. Our 2006 entering freshman class had an average ACT score of 24.2—the national average was 21.1.

## GRAWEMEYER AWARDS

In March UofL's Symphony Orchestra and Wind Ensemble will perform in Carnegie Hall. The concert features works by Grawemeyer Award-winning composers. Each year, the Grawemeyer foundation at UofL awards \$200,000 each to the winners in five categories, including music. Established in 1984 by the late UofL alumnus Charles Grawemeyer, the awards are the first major international prizes to honor powerful ideas in the arts and sciences rather than personal achievement.

## TOP RANKED

The reputation of UofL's academic programs is growing. As an example, the recent U.S. News & World Report rankings listed the College of Business' undergraduate program among the nation's Top 7 percent and its entrepreneurship program in the Top 20. U.S. News also named the College of Education and Human Development one of America's Top 100 graduate schools.

## FINDING CURES

Two UofL researchers, Alfred Bennett "Ben" Jenson and Shin-je Ghim, were part of the team that recently discovered a 100-percent effective vaccine against cervical cancers caused by HPV.

They continue their pioneering research on cancer treatment at the James Graham Brown Cancer Center.

Other cancer center researchers have isolated embryonic-like stem cells in adult mice, which may alter stem cell research.

## RESTORING LIVES

A team from UofL and Kleinert, Kutz and Associates Hand Care Center proved hand transplants were possible by performing the nation's first successful procedure in 1999. They just completed their third. Two other UofL surgeons, Laman Gray and Robert Dowling, performed the world's first two successful AbioCor fully implantable replacement heart implants. Both the hand and heart teams conducted their procedures at Jewish Hospital.

## NIH FUNDING SOARS

UofL's NIH funding growth is the fastest in the nation among research universities, reflecting both the quality and quantity of studies being conducted here. UofL is transferring the results of its research into commercial enterprise. Eighteen business startups are a direct result of this research to date.

## FOCUSED ON DIVERSITY

The master of art's degree in Pan-African studies was the first graduate degree program in black studies in Kentucky when it was established in 2002.
