

UofL has raised its admissions standards three times over the past seven years to emphasize the quality of student we attract. Our 2007 entering freshman class had an average ACT score of 24.3—the national average was 21.2.

GRADUATING MORE

In 2007 UofL graduated its largest December class ever—nearly 1,400 students. Even more noteworthy, UofL's graduation rate is rising faster than any of Kentucky's eight public universities—a jump of 7.4 percent increase between 2004 and 2006. CARDINAL COVENANT

In fall 2007 Uofl implemented Cardinal Convenant to assist students living at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty level. Eligible students receive funds to help pay for the cost of a UofL education. During the 2007-08 academic year, 169 students participated. UofL was the first college in Kentucky to implement
