

## RESEARCH BREAKTHROUGHS

UofL continued its growth as a premier metropolitan research university with life-changing discoveries and impacts including helping a paralyzed man stand six years after a complete spinal cord injury. We also used one of our largest-ever federal grants to revolutionize the treatment of heart disease, measured the power of trees as a public health strategy, explored the effects of environmental pollutants on cardiometabolic disease and liver disease, and used music to unite young and old.



## MAKING A DIFFERENCE

UofL's Signature Partnership Initiative, a university-wide effort to enhance the quality of life and educational and economic opportunity for residents of West Louisville, celebrated a decade of community impact. In the 2016-2017 academic year, there were 263 university-community activities in West Louisville through the initiative. Thousands of UofL students and hundreds of faculty and staff have been involved.

## MILESTONES MARKED

The university had ample cause for celebration in 2017, as many schools and organizations recognized their long histories of academic excellence, student support and serving our community.

- The School of Medicine commemorated its 180th anniversary
- The School of Dentistry turned 130 years old
- The Women's Center marked its 25th anniversary
- LGBT Center celebrated a decade of pride.



## UOFL HOSPITAL

UofL's University Medical Center took over management of University of Louisville Hospital and the James Graham Brown Cancer Center following four years of a joint operating agreement with KentuckyOne Health. High-quality staff were retained and increased, and other improvements are well underway, making UofL a continued leader in teaching the next generation of caregivers and providing unsurpassed patient care.

## SINGULAR SCHOLARS

Kentucky's only 2017 Truman Scholar, Judson Adams is from UofL. The award, which recognizes college juniors who are pursuing careers in public service leadership, was given to just 62 U.S. college students in 2017. This is the third year in a row that a UofL student has won the esteemed scholarship.

The university also celebrated in 2017 its first-ever Mitchell Scholar, James May. The prominent award is given to just 12 Americans each year for postgraduate study in Ireland. Awardees are selected based on scholarship, leadership and community service.


## BLAST OFF

## HELPING PAY FOR EDUCATION

UofL invested more than \$133 million on student financial aid in 2016-17. Data show 10,361 undergraduate students received scholarship or grant aid averaging \$4,358 per recipient in Fall 2017.

22% of first-time, full-time degree-seeking students paid \$0 toward in-state tuition, fees, housing and meals.



## DANCING FOR DONATIONS
