# **Research Interests**

I am an interdisciplinary social scientist. My research examines motivation and decision-making processes in human governance and societal dilemmas. I am interested in three broad, interrelated research topics. First, how do people make decisions about governance and policies, and what motivates people to cooperate, in order to solve difficult societal problems? Second, how do democracies function, and how can democratic governance be improved? Third, how can we promote sustainability and resilience of social and ecological resources? I use a range of quantitative and qualitative research methods, from multiple disciplines, to examine these questions. I collaborate with experts and stakeholders from multiple domains to synthesize knowledge, methods, and solutions.
