Her primary areas of research includes: Legal perspectives on public health, health promotion and prevention; Precision medicine and health data - legal and ethical aspects; Patients' rights in an integrated Europe; Health and human rights; Biolaw and regulation of biotechnology; Law, Science and Technology Studies; Law and ethics.
