Stefani Negri is Associate Professor of International Law, School of Law at the University of Salerno since 2004 and Chair of Public International Law since 2010. She also holds the Jean Monnet Chair in European Health, Environmental and Food Safety Law. Professor Negri is Director of the "Observatory on Human Rights: Bioethics, Health, Environment", which is based at the School of Law of the University of Salerno, and is a network of academic experts (from 12 European and American countries) promoting international cooperation in teaching and

research in the fields of international law, human rights law, health and biomedical law, environmental law.

The aims of the Observatory are both didactic and scientific. Didactic activities mainly include the organization of cultural initiatives, such as conferences, workshops, meetings and seminars dedicated to undergraduate and graduate students of the Law Faculty. Research activities are mainly carried out in the context of international research projects approved and financed by the University of Salerno, the Italian Ministry of University and Research and foreign institutions.

Professor Negri was the Research director (2014-2016) for the International research project on "Measures of contrast and punishment of international organs trade and trafficking in the perspective of international, European and comparative law" financed by the University of Salerno (FARB 2014)
