The Rapid ART Study is a health system intervention that will address structural barriers to facilitate ART therapy initiation as soon as possible after an individual is diagnosed with HIV.

The goal of the study is to determine if the rapid start of antiretroviral (ART) therapy increases retention in HIV medical care.
