- 6. Work in preparation:

During my Sabbatical leave (Spring 2002) I completed about 70 percent of the work on a book which greatly expands my 1996 article in <u>Visual Sociology</u> on visual methods for studying social change. The work on this project required not only substantial additional text, but also considerable additional laboratory and field work. Presently I have a total of somewhat over a hundred pages of text and more than sixty photographs and figures. The "modular" organization of the book has made the work on it very satisfying. Some of the sections of the book are pretty near a finished state while others remain in a state of flux, pending the capture of the appropriate images and completion of the background work. The biggest and most frustrating obstacles that remain look at

present to be those of securing the use of some existing published images, and obtaining usable, i.e., reproducible, versions of those images. Work on this book is at a stalemate at the present time.

Beginning in 2012-13 I have collaborated with a former student, now an educator in the Bowling Green Public School System, as a co-author, on developing an existing manuscript into submissible form for the journal, *Popular Music and Society*, under the tentative title, "The Sociology of Bassists." I have assembled substantial bibliographic material for the literature review and have partially revised a first draft. Patrick O'Rourke is my colleague on this project and is an actual bassist, so, at the very least, he will be making a vital contribution in ensuring the validity of the content. Who will be first author hasn't been addressed yet. This project has been inched forward during 2015: I have re-edited the manuscript but my co-author has not yet made his input to the most recent version. Only minor progress was made on this manuscript during 2016.

### **G.** Work in Progress

1. Continuing project: My current research project in Ontonagon County Study has been a collaborative effort with Professor Harry Schwarzweller of Michigan State University, who has now retired. This research was begun in 1957 by Prof. Allan Beegle of MSU. It was initially framed as a longitudinal study of social and geographic mobility among rural youth from this area of Michigan's Upper Peninsula but has evolved into an extended study of social change in a rural community. This is a long-term project which has produced a continuing stream of reports including: 1) a visual essay on community decline, published in the wide-circulation ASA journal, Contexts (2002); 2) a paper on retrospective strategies for studying social change, published in the journal Visual Studies (2003); 3) a "revision" feature entitled "Changing Spaces" in Contexts (2004); 4) conference papers at the IVSA (2004) and RSS (2006) on social change in the

small community of Trout Creek as reflected in the experience of the Carlisle family. An update on the continuing decline in Ontonagon County was published in the summer of 2009 in a visual essay in the ASA journal, <u>Contexts</u>. A summary article on the visual method used in the Ontonagon Project appeared in the <u>Handbook of Visual Research Methods</u> published by Sage in 2011. (In 2016 Sage announced that this article would be retained in the second edition of the Handbook to be published in 2017.) A paper outlining strategies for reconstructing social change in small isolated communities has been published in the journal Qualitative Inquiry in 2014.

During 2015 I conducted the quinqinial repeat photographic survey (on film) of Ontonagon County. This was a comprehensive documentation (600 photographs) of all of the benchmark sites in the study area. The processing of this project film, originally planned for Fall 2015, was held up by a persistent plumbing problem in my photo lab. That processing was completed in the spring of 2016. During 2016 I worked with the UofL Photographic Archives in a continuing joint project of scanning, digitizing, and cataloging all of the materials from the Ontonagon Project. During the spring of 2016, that effort was concentrated on the complete photographic survey completed during the summer of 2015. One focus of my current work is on chronicling and analyzing the community's recent struggle to respond to the Michigan Department of Transportation's disruptive action in replacing and relocating a major bridge over the Ontonagon River at the western edge of the town. (This is the largest river entering Lake Superior from its southern shore.) To that end, in Summer 2015 I managed to obtain (on loan) a complete run (on microfilm) of the local newspaper for the fifteen years that frame the saga. During the fall of 2015 and through 2016, I have been gradually working my way through those newspapers and, as of February 2017, have completed a review of all the coverage up to the period January 2003 to March 2007. During field work in the summer 2016, I completed sixty photographs of sites that had changed since the previous quinquinial survey and conducted interviews apropos of the changes underway in the study area.
