A twenty minute interview was conducted with residents of nine households living on the site and a sample of 301 households in the immediate area of the proposed action. Also a mail questionnaire was sent to a sample of 34 persons in Indiana and Kentucky who were nominated as influential residents of the region. This data was content analyzed and with the two surveys was used as a basis for writing a report concerning several aspects of sociological impact.
