Personal Statement

My lifetime goal is to make a serious and substantive contribution to what we do, what we think, and how we think about global maternal and infant health, including maternal death, neonatal death and stillbirths, and the social position and health of women. I want to improve epidemiologic methods to lend insight into the upstream predicates of maternal and infant health and fully understand what interventions work and why in order to implement evidence-based policy and practice. Since 2018, I have been director of the MPH in Global Maternal and Child Health Program. I have developed and taught or co-taught roughly 30 separate courses, including seminars and study abroad programs, epidemiologic methods, maternal and child health, and epidemiologic theory. I have authored/co-authored 38 peer-reviewed manuscripts along with dozens of monographs and editorials.
