- Check frequently as on-campus opportunities fill quickly. Follow application instructions listed for each.

Candid Career Videos - a library of short videos on hundreds of career fields and job search topics.

Cardinal Career Compass - a four-year plan outlining steps to take during each year as an undergraduate.

Focus 2 - is an online career education planning system. It provides a picture of your interests, values, personality, skills, and leisure activities using self-assessment questionnaires, interest inventories, and personality testing.
