SAFETY Tip of the Week

If you shovel snow, do stretching exercises to warm up before you take on this arduous task. If you have any medical conditions, especially high blood pressure, heart disease or history of stroke, do not shovel snow at all. If you do decide to shovel, take breaks often.
