

## Considering the Pass/Fail option?

Your Advisor can help you decide. Here are some things you might consider:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I will probably make a D-, D, D+ or C- in this class if I don't change anything in terms of my effort.</li><li>• I've struggled with the class even when it was face-to-face and I may be failing right now.</li><li>• I'm really freaked-out about completing this class online and, although I have a good grade now, it is likely to go down, potentially to a D.</li><li>• The class is not a pre-requisite for any other classes or programs.</li><li>• The class is not required for my major and what I learn here will not be built upon in later classes in my major.</li><li>• The class is not something that is required to get into a professional school (Nursing, Medical, Dental, etc.)</li><li>• Switching to P/F will not decrease my engagement in the course or jeopardize my learning the material.</li><li>• I'm repeating this class because I failed it the first time I took it and I do not need a letter grade in it for professional schools or other reasons.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I'm earning an A or B now and will likely keep this grade if I don't change anything in terms of effort in the class.</li><li>• I have a GPA below a 2.0 which is required for satisfactory academic progress. I'm making a C or above in this class and need a good grade to increase my GPA. (do the calculations first – your advisor can help with this)</li><li>• A grade in the class is required for admission to a professional school in which I am interested. (UofL Medical and Dental schools will accept a P but, other schools may not. YOU need to check with those other schools.)</li><li>• The class is required for my major and it is a fundamental class that will be built upon in later classes. If I switch to P/F, I know that I will be less engaged and less likely to learn all of the material that I need to do well in subsequent classes.</li><li>• I receive funding or support that depends on a letter grade in this class. (unlikely)</li><li>• I am a pre-nursing student applying to Nursing school and must have a C or above in this course to be accepted into Nursing School.*</li></ul>

\*Note that in some cases a P will be acceptable for the UofL but, the Nursing School prefers students to have a letter grade. Check before your decide.
