WHAT GOES INTO THE DECISION OF CANCELLING SUMMER 2021 TRAVEL?

- Students are not permitted to travel to CDC COVID-19 Levels 3 and 4 locations for any reason.
- We consider local conditions as well as input from peer institutions, our third-party providers, and our overseas partners.
- If there is significant uncertainty about conditions at the host locations, including COVID-19 issues, UofL may elect to cancel all international travel for summer 2021

What should you consider when deciding to go abroad this summer?

- You may not be able to enter the destination country based on the destination's current travel restrictions
- There may be a mandatory 14-day self-isolation/quarantine period upon arrival in the destination country
- Your program may be abruptly ended by the provider or host institution if conditions worsen
- Travel restrictions may change while abroad, prohibiting you from returning to the U.S.
- There may be a need to self-isolate upon return to the U.S.
- As a returning traveler, you must provide a negative COVID test, taken within 72 hours of departure, or show proof of recovery from COVID within the last 90 days. You will be responsible for the cost of this test, which could cost \$75 or more.
- You may not be permitted to leave your host country for independent travel

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Office of Study Abroad and International travel strongly recommends that you purchase fully refundable airline tickets and/or trip cancellation insurance to safeguard against losses or penalties associated with withdrawal or program cancellation. UofL assumes no responsibility for such losses or penalties.

If you are planning on study abroad this summer check your provider's cancellation plan carefully. Know your deadlines for a full refund and check your UofL email from information from your study abroad advisor.
