Both the scope and depth of sustainability initiatives at UofL expanded significantly over the course of the year. These are some highlights *July 2016 - June 2017*.



## **OPERATIONS**

## Air & Climate

 UofL released its <u>2016 Greenhouse Gas Emissions</u> Report, documenting that, over the long-term, we have reduced our carbon emissions, even as we continue to grow in physical size, campus population, and budgetary expenditures. From 2006 to 2016, UofL's net carbon emissions dropped nearly 25% from 236,101 to 177,704 metric tons. UofL is well on its way to achieving our first milestone goal of a 20% reduction in emissions from our 2008 baseline by 2020. In 2016, we stood at an 18.69% reduction from 2008, or 40,836 metric tons of CO2 equivalent per year. This translates to: Taking 8,262 cars off the road; 12,960 tons (or 1,851 garbage trucks) of waste recycled instead of landfilled; Emission from 4,312 average U.S. homes' annual energy use; 217 rail cars worth of coal burned;1.45M incandescent lamps switched to LEDs; or the carbon sequestered by 38,656 acres of U.S. forests in one year.



# **Buildings & Energy**

### **ENERGY EFFICIENCY & RENEWABLE ENERGY**

 The Sustainability Council and Campus Housing installed a new <u>solar umbrella charging station</u> for campus as a "Green Renovation" prize for Bettie Johnson Hall, whose residents cut electricity use by 27.5% during the <u>Spring 2016 Ecolympics</u>! The Powersol charges its battery with 54 watts and can charge three devices simultaneously (F'16).



- UofL invested \$3566 in four <u>eTemp</u> units for a pilot test study of their energy savings in UofL Dining refrigeration and freezer units (S'17).
- UofL replaced lighting with high-efficiency, cooler, brighter LEDs in portions of the Baptist Campus Center, the lobby of the Playhouse, and in the dining area of the Ville Grill, where 240 42W bulbs were replaced with 26W LEDs. At the Ville Grill alone, this cut lighting energy use 38% for a savings of \$1268/year (2.8 year payback) before even accounting for reduced load on HVAC (May'17).

# Grounds

 UofL achieved <u>Tree Campus USA</u> status from the Arbor Day Foundation for the 7th year running (S'17).



 Biology Professor, Margaret Carreiro, received \$450 award from Louisville Nature Center and Kentucky Waterways Alliance to plant a new woodland understory patch of native plants between Life Sciences and Strickler Hall.

## Purchasing

 UofL stockroom ceased the purchase of soaps and other products with Triclosan or any of the other prophylactic antibiotics banned by the FDA, and appropriate language eliminating their use on campus was added to the <u>Green Purchasing Policy</u>. (F'16)

## Transportation

• The Council launched a new online platform for tripplanning and carpool-matching, <u>Cardinal Directions</u>, which displays all transportation options and impacts on one intuitive map. Uses new platform to run 9/17/16 ESPN College Game Day car-free challenge; and 10/17-23/16 UofL Sustainability Week commuter challenge (F'16).



 UofL Foundation implemented a <u>road diet on Floyd</u> <u>Street</u> through Belknap campus from University to Brandeis, reducing a dangerous four-lane road to two lanes with bike lanes in both directions, a dedicated bus pull-out and a low-speed, yielding roundabout to replace an awkward, inefficient, and dangerous traffic light at Brandeis (F'16).



- UofL hosted <u>public meetings on the redesign of Hill</u> <u>Street</u> at the northeastern edge of Belknap campus. The unsafe, four-lane corridor under the railroad overpass was ultimately given a "road diet" treatment by Metro Public Works that improves safety, with bike lanes in both directions and dedicated turn-lanes (S'17).
- <u>UofL car-share program expanded to HSC</u>, serving downtown with a new, on-street permitted parking location on Preston at Kornhauser plaza (May'16).


## BICYCLING

- The Council's <u>Earn-A-Bike program</u> received 560 applications from students, faculty & staff willing to forgo a UofL parking permit for 2 years in exchange for a \$400 voucher to local bike shops (F'16).
- Partnered with Bicycling for Louisville and Falls City Community Bikeworks to teach mandatory bike commuter classes for all 368 <u>Earn-A-Bike</u> voucher recipients and follow-up optional bike maintenance workshops. Pre- and post-class quizzes demonstrated a 17% improvement in knowledge over one-hour course (F'16).
- From May-Sept 2016, the Council and Get Healthy Now organized UofL participation in the <u>National Bike</u> <u>Challenge</u>, incentivizing 25 active riders to pedal 19,748mi (#107 national rank of workplaces), burning over 1M calories, saving \$1,787, and preventing 2,847lbs of carbon emissions.
- LouVelo city-wide bikeshare launches with stations at UofL and over 300 bikes at 27 locations from Belknap to HSC. Half-priced memberships offered to the UofL community. (May'17)



## Solid Waste

• In 2016, UofL increased its overall <u>landfill diversion</u> <u>rate</u> (through recycling, composting, and reusing) to 79% from 43% in 2015.



• Unfortunately, this was achieved in the context of a 1.5 times increase in total <u>solid waste generation</u>, thanks to several demolition and construction projects in 2016.



 <u>Surplus medical equipment from UofL gets a second</u> <u>life in Ghana</u> (S'17)  The <u>Free Store</u> in Unitas Hall staffed by volunteers for weekly hours throughout year for free exchange of clothing, shoes, books, and household items. Council secures the donation from Republic Services of new outdoor collection bins for the Free Store (F'16-S'17).



 The <u>Lighten Your Load! Move-Out Waste Reduction</u> collected hundreds of pounds of donations for Goodwill (S'17).

 Establishing a student-managed green fund as part of the endowment; and

4. Developing a general investment policy for the university/foundation as a whole. (F'16)

 UofL began participating in shareholder advocacy through a contract with <u>Institutional Shareholder</u> <u>Services (ISS)</u> to help us manage our proxy voting at shareholder meetings. We began the service using the standard <u>Socially Responsible Investment (SRI)</u> <u>Proxy Voting Guidelines</u> (July'16).

## Campus as a Living Lab

- Worms: Professor Linda Fuselier uses worms from the UofL Community Composting operation as a study subject for students in BIOL104 labs (F'16).
- <u>Conn Center exploring industrial hemp</u> (Aug.'16) <u>Farmers flock to Conn Center forum on industrial</u> <u>hemp</u> (Dec.'16) <u>Conn Center plants industrial hemp in quest for</u> <u>renewable energy</u> (May'17)
- <u>Tapping Campus Trees for Syrup</u>: 28 students in two new plant-focused sections of BIOL 104 Laboratory for Introduction to Biological Systems taught by TA Grace Freundlich (guided by Linda Fuselier) tapped 20 trees on Belknap campus to gather sap for syrup, learn about the process, and study the environmental conditions that influence it. The Biology Department invested in its own tapping equipment and experimented with tapping other kinds of trees for

sap. The syrup-making arrangement with our community partner, Dave Barker, was maintained and he oversaw the tapping of trees on UofL's Shelby Campus for the first time ever. Dave Barker returned to campus to explain the process and share the finished product with the campus community at a <u>Feb. Garden Commons workshop</u> and Apr. EcoReps Lunch & Learn. Video. (S'17).



- As the capstone to a semester of work, UofL <u>Urban</u> <u>Planning grad students</u> were tasked with helping the city of Louisville improve its 4-star sustainability rating in the STAR Community Rating System. The students investigated ways Louisville could improve by better matching public transportation to jobs and housing and improving walkability and infrastructure. Students approached this task by mapping out likely areas for transit oriented development (S'17).
- Public Health majors in professor David Johnson's spring course, PHUN 420 Public Health Practice, were charged with the task of mapping the current state of the <u>Smoke-free Campus</u> signage, presenting their findings in a report, and making recommendations to the Council and administration for new and/or improved signage (S'17).

## Research

 Council organized biweekly <u>Sustainability</u> <u>Roundtables</u> throughout the academic year for faculty, staff, students, practitioners, teachers, government officials, and members of the public to share their projects or ideas in search of interdisciplinary collaboration (F'16 & S'17).  UofL funds new <u>Cooperative Consortium for</u> <u>Transdisciplinary Social Justice Research</u> to provide a hub to bring faculty, students and the community together on issues of social and racial justice. Initial research focus areas include community justice, environmental justice and emerging social justice issues (F'16).

 Council & Campus Housing organized <u>Ecolympics</u> <u>2017</u>, with UofL participating in two national sustainability competitions:



1. RecycleMania! (Feb. 5 to Apr. 1, 2017), a friendly annual competition among North American universities. During this 8 week period, UofL compete to reduce waste, increase recycling & composting, and raise conservation awareness across all three campuses! In the Grand Champion category, UofL was #1 in the state and 37th out of 190 nationally, with an overall Recycling Rate of 53.885%. UofL came in 2nd in Kentucky for the Per Capita Classic, having recycled 10.777 lbs/person (102nd nationally). The Cards also did a whole lot of composting, nearly doubling our 2016 numbers and keeping 3.719 lbs/person of food waste out of the landfills (ranking us 72nd nationally and 2nd in Kentucky behind Berea College). In Waste Minimization, UofL finished 2nd in the state and 35th in the nation, generating 26.903 lbs/person of total waste. UofL was the only Kentucky school to enter the Electronics Waste Recycling competition with our pilot E-waste collection of 233 lbs of electronics. This all translated to reducing

B sustain.

UofL's greenhouse gas emissions by 451 Metric Tons (equivalent to taking 89 cars off the road, or the energy consumption of 39 households).

2. The Campus Conservation Nationals from

February 13 to March 5, 2017. Out of the eight major residence halls on Belknap campus, four were able to reduce electricity consumption over the three weeks, thanks to the conservation efforts of residents: Bettie Johnson Hall reduced 18.5%; Unitas Tower reduced 5.1%; Miller Hall reduced 2.8%; and Threlkeld Hall reduced 1.8% (S'17).
