WELCOME FROM THE DIRECTOR

Happy Women's History Month!

How are you doing right now, really? How are you feeling as we witness a concerted movement to roll back historic progress made in community-wide policies ranging from reproductive justice to DEI education? I feel a range of emotions as I explore how I can support <u>cooperative care work</u> as an individual to <u>reimagine</u> systems for gender equity. I feel disheartened at times but mindful practices for emotional regulation help me see more clearly my next steps. I am still excited about the <u>multilayered strategic efforts to dismantle</u> <u>patriarchy</u> in <u>Kentucky</u> and <u>beyond</u>. What can we learn from <u>leaders, now</u> and <u>in the past,</u> who <u>stood up</u> together against harmful policies and practices? What would <u>Grace Lee Boggs, Grimke sisters, Anne Braden,</u> and<u> Gertrude Simmons Bonnin</u> say to us? How would <u>Emma Amos, Silvia Walker,</u> and <u>Angela Morley</u> answer the Women's Center's new driving questions for our organization:

- What is <u>leadership</u> to you?
- How do we build and sustain a group that supports intersectional feminist and antiracist goals? What are the most effective communication approaches for diverse communities that lead to better understanding of core issues?
- How do you "fail up" in leadership? What happens when you feel that you or your group made a mistake?
- How do you integrate self-care, consensual pleasure practices and radical joy into your leadership roles?
- What are today's best practices in gender equity?

THE ART OF QUESTIONING

I find that questions can generate multi-tiered solutions for longstanding problems and facilitate difficult conversations across differences. Intentional questioning also fosters reflection about processes or "The How" to make systemic change. When we survey the methods that people used to advocate for human rights in 1783, 1891 or 2024 for native people, immigrant women, trans folks, birthing people, queer femmes, persons with disabilities, rural women and families - we have a treasure-trove of strategies to explore, discover, reuse or discard. We all benefit from a <u>"herstory"</u> of brave women, femmes, and <u>gender non-</u> conforming folks who questioned the status quo and mobilized others.

WORK-LIFE INTEGRATION
Designing and responding to questions can also make me tired. My brain sometimes needs rest, art making, laughter, a funny song, and a good nap to recover from the emotional labor in questioning. As a human being coming out of a historic pandemic, I am figuring out how to best navigate life. So, I am reminded by the inspirational words by the prolific poet, Nayyirah Waheed to take healthy breaks in movement building. She writes:

> be easy. take your time. you are coming home. to vourself. - the becoming I wing

In coming home to myself, I plan to cultivate more joy during these challenging times by attending celebratory events for gender equality. 

ADVOCACY IN ACTION

"WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH CELEBRATION?"

While some women can celebrate the history their ancestors did while other may never know what their ancestors did as they have been covered up through white-washed history.

- Women across the world are still fighting for livelihood. This may seem like it is happening in another country, but it is happening here in America.
- Women of color are consistently disenfranchised throughout the nation, especially in the South. Partisan and racial gerrymandering renders their votes useless when grouped in a constituency with another party's majority.

Legislation Impacting Women

- The Alabama Supreme Court just ruled that frozen embryos are people and embryos not implanted (most are not at a single time) can be seen as abandonment.
- Missouri has a law since 1973 that pregnant people cannot get a divorce
 while they are pregnant, they must wait until after the baby is born, even in
 cases of domestic violence.


